



## Mid-term Report Year 2022/2023

### Sauch Kha Hong Sar School



After two years of not being able to offer classes on our school campuses, we were finally able to start the new school year on **June 1st 2022** at all our schools and in attendance. It was a special day for all teachers and children, but especially for the three year groups who entered the school building for the first time since their enrolment. Adjusting to everyday school life was not difficult, as everyone felt the need for normality and a direct exchange with classmates and teachers.

Return to **normality** also meant that we could finally return to the normal distribution of school uniforms to all our pupils. Together with providing the children with **school materials** and the organisation of safe school transport, the school uniforms form an important pillar of our school project. In this way, we want to ensure that no child is prevented from receiving a basic school education due to poverty. In addition, the **school uniform** provides **protection** and safety for the children.



To get the school year off to a good start, the first **parent-teacher meeting** took place on June 15th, where important topics for the upcoming school year were discussed, such as general school and community activities, as well as **health projects**.





To further integrate active students into the school day, a "**Student Leader Training**" programme has been launched at all our schools. This is a training that selected students undergo to know about the handling of Covid-19 and awareness about dangerous materials in their environment. After completion of the training, an additional training including how to conduct **eye assessments** for students in the school or psychological early detection was held by the Thai public health department, which was attended by both the Student Leaders and the health teachers of each school. The aim is to identify children with these problems in the schools and to provide them with timely help.



As part of the emphasis on health and with the aim of supporting a healthy development and growth of our school children, **school milk** was distributed to all children on a regular basis.

During the months of June and July, a **computer course** was held every Saturday which was attended by all teachers. As we helped to upgrade all our schools last year with new PCs and equipment to make teaching easier throughout the pandemic and to support the process of **improving administration** and data collection in general, we want to ensure that the full potential of the technology is utilised and that all teachers are familiar with the most important programmes. For this reason, another workshop was held in October to deepen the content already covered. The workshops also aim to give the teachers the tools to better **prepare lessons**, create worksheets and generally integrate the computer as a teaching tool into the lessons.







In August, the students participated in the Ah Yone Oo School football tournament. This was done to foster the connection between the two schools and to strengthen the **sense of community**. In September, Sauch Kha Hong Sar School benefited from some health activities, such as Covid-19 vaccinations and distribution of vitamin A and iron supplements. Furthermore, the eyes of all children were checked for visual impairment or other problems.

The **mid-term examinations** took place in October. In general, the headmasters and teachers are very satisfied with the results, especially considering that no regular classes could take place for almost 2 years.

In November, our team, the school headmaster, the teachers and the children were very happy about the **visit of Laurence Pian** President of the Jan & Oscar Foundation and her companions.
