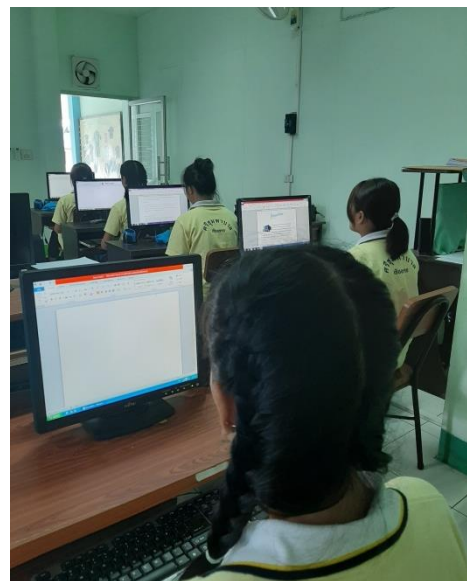
Sewing Class

The students who have some free time during the day would attend the Sewing class. They learn how to make dresses and bags etc.



Computer Training

Computer class is provided for the students to learn basic computer, programs, typing, internet and searching information for their studies.



Religious Activities

Catholic students and those interested attend Mass every Sunday at the parish in Phan. Occasionally some students attend Buddhist ritual in the nearby temple.



Student Projects

The students presented their practical based projects twice a year. This presentation is for academic year 1/2019. These projects have to receive the approval from the Government Non-Formal Education Committee as part of Non formal education curriculum.



Gardening and Horticulture

Integrated farming in an area of 7 rai is an activity to develop professional skills and practice the sufficiency economy of King Rama the ninth. Every Wednesday students will go the garden under supervision of the teachers.



Volunteer Teacher for English Language

A qualified volunteer English teacher from Dublin, Ireland, arrives twice a year to teach the students all aspect of the English language. Conversation and exam strategy take up a good amount of the time. The English teacher presents each student with an English certificate of participation at the end of the course.



Legal Seminar/Training

This course was organized by Good Shepherd Youth Welfare Center to train and provide skills needed to people in 3 villages. It covered many aspects of the legal requirements, human rights issues, abuse and anti- human trafficking. The doctors from nearby village also came to join us. They taught basic health care. “To be Number One” another group who works on anti-drugs came to introduce themselves to the villagers too.



Capacity Building for Personnel

A three day session was organized for all Good Shepherd personnel in Thailand. They studied law: family law and law regarding women and children. The spirit and mission of The Good Shepherd was renewed. Many projects were planned and discussed. It was a good opportunity for each participant from different sites to meet and get to know each other.



Cooking Class

A group of volunteers from Singapore came to teach baking sweets for students. Students at work in the kitchen. (The Good Shepherd Bakery). This is the fifth year for this project. We have started to sell cake which the girls had made.



Visit Our Student's Home

Sisters and staff visited the students' home. To meet and ask about the well-being providing advice on education, health, lifestyle, child care, issue of human trafficking etc.



Art Therapy

A French volunteer came to teach drawing during the holidays. It was a relaxation activities. Everyone enjoyed it and got chance to express themselves through drawing.



Ensure the Standard of the Social Welfare Institute. 26th August 2019

The Government Social Development and Human Security, Chiang Rai Province and team which composed of local district governor, public health and engineer visited the social welfare institution. Everything that concern safety, hygienic and welfare of the students were inspected eg. bedrooms, bathrooms, fire-exit, dining room, kitchen, personal filing, first aid box etc. This is done yearly in order to ensure the standard of the institute before they approve the renewal of government permission for us to continue operate as Social Welfare Center.



Participate in Social Activities with Non-Formal Education Department

Students participated in the activities organized by the Non-Formal Education, Phan. Good Shepherd Youth Welfare Center won the first prize for the projects contest and fashion show contest. The fashion dress was made by recycle items.



Walk Rally - Campaign to End Violence Against Women and Children and Stop Human Trafficking

To participate in World Day(s) to End Violence Against Women and Children, our staff prepared many activities for the students in order to raise their awareness on this issue.

Sr. Sutisa organized a Walk Rally in the city of Nongkhai for this purpose. There were over 3,000 participants from 118 institutions of GO's, NGO's and Schools. Some of us from Chiang Rai also participated in this campaign.



Fire drills

Twice a year we organized the fire drills in order to prevent the danger and prepare the students to be ready to cope with the emergency situation caused by fire.
